Data Processing Agreement

1. By ticking the box "I agree with the information reg. processing of personal data" in our "Lawyer online" form you give consent to Nocarová Partners Advokáti s.r.o., with its registered office at V Jirchářích 148/4, Id. No. 047 97 469, registered in the Commercial Register of the Municipal Court in Prague, Section C, Insert 253724 (hereinafter the "Data Controller"), according to the Regulation Number 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council, on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (hereinafter "the Regulation"), to process following personal data:
 - Name and Surname
 - Address
 - E-mail
 - Telephone Number
2. Name and Surname, Address, E-mail, Telephone Number can possibly be processed, based on your consent, and are necessary to process in order to provide you with our service "Lawyer online". The Data Controller is required to keep your personal data for 10 years starting the date of your consent.
3. You give your explicit consent to the aforesaid data processing. Providing us with your personal data is voluntary. You are allowed to withdraw your consent anytime by sending us an e-mail or a letter to our contact address.
4. Your personal information is processed by the Data Controller, but it is possible to delegate it to:
 - a. The provider of the software service Praetor – information system for the Czech and Slovak Advocacy
 - b. More service providers of processing systems, services and applications, which we are currently not using.
5. Please keep in mind, that regarding the Regulation you are allowed to:
 - withdraw your consent anytime
 - seek what information we gather and ask for a copy of such information
 - demand access to your personal data, update or correct it or even limit us in processing your personal information
 - demand us to delete your personal data
 - port your personal data
 - file a complaint with The Office for Personal Data Protection or a court.
